

## **Sport Premium Overview 2018/19**

*“Working Together, Learning Together, Growing Together”*

At Bushy Hill Junior School we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with the potential to change young people’s lives for the better.

We continue to welcome the Government’s additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. We are committed to using this resource in developing high quality PE lessons, alongside providing greater sporting opportunities such as competitions and clubs for all our pupils.

### **Sport Premium Grant**

Funding for schools was calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) as at the annual census in January 2015. All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils received a lump sum of £16,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil. Smaller schools received £500 per pupil.

## What does the Sport Premium mean for my School?

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013).

At Bushy Hill, our priority is: **To raise achievement and attainment in PE, as well as increase the levels of participation from children in all aspects of Sport.** We have found the additional Sport Premium Grant highly beneficial in helping to deliver on a number of key actions, as detailed in the following table:

Spend Area	Total Spend	Action	Outcome / impact
External Coaching/ Workshops	£4,322.50	Extra coaching sessions for G&T children during lunchtimes	External coaches are used in additional sessions to support and extend the gifted sporting children. It allows them to make the most of their talents and helps them progress into elite standards. This has also impacted on recent competitions including top five placings in the Yr 3/4 and Yr 5/6 sports hall athletics and improved team placings in cross country events.
		Coaching sessions and clubs provided for reluctant sporting children	Provide positive encouragement for children who are reluctant towards participating in physical activity.
		Hardball cricket coaching	Provide specialist coaching in hard ball cricket to allow the children to progress their skills and encourage future participation in the game in secondary school or local cricket clubs.
Trips/Sporting events	£3581.10	Yr6 Kayak Club	The children were given the opportunity to gain experience and proficiency qualifications in an outdoor activity that very few of the children had been exposed to before. This encourages children to partake in non-traditional sports and outdoor adventure activities. It also led to a Summer camp where 16 children attended.
		'District Sports' Year 3 and 4 'Sports Hall Athletics' event in the spring term Year 5 and 6 'Sports Hall Athletics' event in the spring term	The children have applied the skills they have learnt in PE lessons and gained experience of competing with others. This year due to the extra provision, participation and sporting results have improved.
		'Sports Crew' Training	A group of Children were selected to attend training in sports leadership, where they were encouraged to promote and run active sporting events in the school. Not only does this allow these children to gain valuable experience in planning, teamwork and independence – it is also a great way to encourage the rest of the children in the school through the encouragement of their peers.

		<b>Children entered into range of triathlon/aquathlon/marathon events.</b>	Children are given opportunities to compete in large organised sporting events inside and outside school environments. Attendance of these events also raises the profile of the school as a place of sporting excellence. Children managed to place in podium positions in a range of events.
<b>Equipment</b>	£1890.26	<b>Update and extend the range of equipment available</b>	Equipment was purchased to support the teaching of a range of sports during PE lessons and sports clubs to progress the skills of the children and promote active lifestyles. In addition it has provided much needed resources to support identified needs of individuals within the school.
<b>CPD</b>	£2057.50	<b>PE lead covered whilst supervising external sporting events</b>	Ensuring the children have the opportunity to attend as wide range of sporting events as possible during the school day.
		<b>'Sport Premium and Health wheel' staff workshop</b>	The course provided information and resources to allow the PE lead to assess the quality of the provision of PE and physical activity in the school and help ensure the sports premium budget is being spent effectively.
		<b>PE conference</b>	Developing ideas into the planning and assessment PE within the school. Networking with other schools to promote positive relationships and development opportunities.
<b>Equipment maintenance</b>	£800	<b>Provide a wide range of safe and certified equipment</b>	Children have access to a wide range of sporting facilities including gymnastics equipment, all weather pitch and large sports field.
<b>Sports membership</b>	£415	<b>Join chosen sporting memberships to allow the children to enter into sporting activities and events.</b>	The children have access to a wide range of competitive sporting events as well as sporting festivals and coaching opportunities.

Remaining balance to be carried forward as committed funding in providing vouchers for parents to purchase the new range of PE kit being made available for the next academic year.

Whilst we feel we have made great progress towards raising achievement and attainment in PE and increasing levels of participation in sport, we have identified the following next steps going forward and we will continue to use the **Sport Premium Grant** to support these, as detailed in the following table:

Next steps	Planned outcomes
<b>Additional purchasing of sporting equipment.</b>	Continually provide the children with quality equipment in order for the to develop their abilities in P.E.
<b>Continual training for PE coordinator and staff.</b>	Further training in instigating the P.E curriculum across the whole staff.
<b>Release time for the PE Coordinator to carry out monitoring of the subject within the school and deliver further training to members of staff in identified aspects of PE.</b>	Staff will further develop their skills to be able to teach all aspects of PE confidently resulting in improved outcomes for children. Ensure an appropriate assessment and tracking method is in place.
<b>Update PE kit across the school for children staff and sports teams</b>	Children will have an up to date PE uniform and additional training clothing available.
<b>Further Targeted provision for G&amp;T and reluctant participants</b>	Sporting and coaching opportunities which help children of all physical abilities. Provide an opportunity for every child in the school to take part in physical activity.
<b>Raise the sporting profile of the school in the local area</b>	Provide additional coaching and opportunities to improve performance and attendance in a wide range of sporting events.
<b>Obtain a 'School Games Mark'</b>	Ensure the school is meeting the requirements to obtain a School Games mark in bronze or above.
